John 12 21, "So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir we wish to see Jesus."

See Jesus The King:

> Matthew 1:1, "The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham."

> Matthew 2:2, "saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it arose and have come to worship him."

> Matthew 2:3, "When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him;"

The Lord Jesus Christ as KING!

> Matthew 27:37, "And over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."
