Last week's devotional message was from Psalm 91; John 15 and 1 John 5:13 – 15 and entitled Promises to Those Who Abide:

1. Abiding (meaning):

To dwell, have one's abode, to lodge, to abide, to remain, to continue to be, to wait for

- 2. Promise of NO Fear: Psalm 91:1 - 6
 - 3. Promise of Fruit: John 15:1 - 11
 - 4. Promise of a Future: 1 John 2:18 - 29

Scripture Reading:

John 15:1 - 17

1. We Have Fellowship With The Lord:

- 1.1) John 15:9, "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love."
 We are invited into a LOVE relationship with Almighty God through the living Son of God.
 His love for us is so tender and pure; and yet not demanding, we determine the intimacy level.
- 1.2) 1 Corinthians 1:9, "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."

The idea here is more than an invitation, it involves the truth that he who birthed us (the vine produces the branches) is trustworthy to complete His love purposes.

Philippians 1:6, "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ."

1.3) 1 John 1 (3 and 7), "that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ." And, "But if we walk in the light as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin."

2. We Will Not Wither:

2.1) Jesus declared the HE is the bread of life:

John 6:35 – 40, "Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst. (36) But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe. (37) All that the Father gives me well come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out. (38) For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me. (39) And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he as given me, but raise it up on the last day. (40) For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day."

2.2) Jesus declared that HE gives living water:

John 4:10, "Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

John 7:38 and 39, "Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water. (39) Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified."

3. We Will Grow in Holy Character:

John 15:1 – 11

3.1) Philippians 2:1 - 8

verse 5, "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus,"

3.2) Colossians 3:1-10

verses 1 - 3, "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. (2) Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on the earth. For you have died, and your live is hidden with Christ in God."

3.3) 1 Peter 2:1 - 3

"So put away all malice and all deceit and hypocrisy and envy and all slander. (2) Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation - (3) if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good."
