Text: Leviticus 23:26 - 32

1. Yom Kippur One Of Israel's Holy Days:

1.1) Eight Holy Day in Israel:

Sabbath - Leviticus 23:3 (Weekly)

Significance back to creation

Passover - Leviticus 23:4 – 8 (Spring)

Deliverance from bondage (Egypt)

Unleavened Bread - Leviticus 23:4 – 8 (Spring)

Walking with God (natural left behind)

Firstfruits - Leviticus 23:9 – 14 (Spring)

Early Harvest in the Promised Land

Notice that these three feasts were sequential in the first month of the Jewish calendar on the 14, 15 and 16!

Weeks (Pentecost) - Leviticus 23:15 – 21 (Spring)

God Our Provider

Trumpets - Leviticus 23:23 – 25 (Fall)

Spiritual Preparation of Israel for...

Notice that Trumpets is on the first day of the seventh month and Atonement, Yom Kippur, is on the tenth day of the seventh month. Trumpets marks the end of the agricultural year in Israel.

Yom Kippur - Leviticus 23:26 – 32 (Fall)

Redemption by the blood!!!

Booths - Leviticus 23:33 – 36 (Fall)

Kingdom rest for Israel

2. Yom Kippur the Most Holy Day in the Jewish Calendar:

2.1) Once a year the High Priest entered into the Holy of Holies to present the blood on the Mercy Seat! Leviticus 16:11 – 22

2.2) Once a year, Israel, individually and corporately, would soul search and repent of their sins in preparation for the Atonement offering.
