> Title: That I May Gain Christ **Series:** People of the Way ... 4

Text: John 14:1 to 7; Phlippians 3:1 to 21

Purpose: I want to MOTIVATE my congregation to engage in a self-examination of their values and ask "What am I willing to surrender in order to gain more of Christ Jesus?"

Last Sunday the devotional was from Hebrews 12:1 - 8

- and was entitled "Keeping Our Focus on the Way": ~ 1. Focus Point Number One is the Race
- ~ 2. Focus Point Number Two is the Lord Jesus Christ ~ 3. Focus Point Number Three is Shed Off Sin
- ~ 4. Focus Point Number four is Expect Discipline

1. To Gain Christ I Need to 'Count':

~ Philippians 3:1-11; take special notice of vs. 7-8,

"But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. (8) Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I

have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in

order that I may gain Christ." ~ vs. 8 Paul says, "and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ."

The word "rubbish" is only found this one time in the New Testament! It has an unpleasant meaning, any refuse, as the excrement of animals, offscourings, rub-

- bish, dregs; of things worthless and detestable. ~ consider what Paul is calling "rubbish:" - vs. 5, circumcised (covenant), of Israel, tribe of Benjamin, Hebrew of Hebrews, a Pharisee; vs. 6, zeal – a persecutor of the church, righteousness under the law - blame-
- less. ~ To the Jewish mind these were worthy credentials! Paul said in vs. 7, "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ."
- ~ Paul declared in 1 Timothy 1:15, "The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost."
 - ~ What things in my life do I value that hold me back from gaining more of Christ Jesus?

Luke 18:9 – 14

2. To Gain Christ I Need to 'Press':

~ Philippians 3:12 – 16: notice vs. 12 and 14, "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. (14) I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

- ~ In both vs. 12 and 14 the original word for "press" is the same; it is used some 45 times: 28 times as persecute, 6 times as follow after, 4 times follow, 3 times suffer persecution 3 times sundry
- ~ There is a cost to following Christ Jesus with a full commitment. Some will disapprove of our faith stand. Some will suggest that we are going to an unnecessary extreme.
- ~ Luke 14:25 35 This is incredibly tough!!!

Do I value personal relationships ahead of Christ Jesus? Do I own things or do they own me? I am to be a steward for Christ Iesus.

~ It is important to have a spotter or spotters in our life.

3. To Gain Christ I Need to 'Look':

- Philippians 3:17 21, special attention to vs. 17, "Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us."
- ~ 1 Corinthians 4:16, "I urge you, then, to be imitators of me."
- ~ 1 Corinthians 11:1, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ."
- ~ Hebrews 6:12, "so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises."

4. To Gain the 'Goal':

- ~ In ancient Greece you had to be a citizen of Greece to compete in the Olympic games; you did not compete to become a citizen.
- ~ Paul is doing a Counting, and Pressing, and Looking to the goal NOT to become a Believer, but because he IS a Believer.
- ~ Philippians 3:20 & 21, "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, (21) who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself."

The goal is to experience the resurrection power of Christ in our everyday lives – Philippians 3:10–15
