Faith IS:

Assurance - of things hoped for; Guarantee - of things divinely promised; Title Deed - of things written down; Confirmation

AND

Evidence - of things not seen; Conviction - of their reality; Comprehends - as fact the non-physical

- · A holy hoping for the best.
- Faith is NOT a call to believe in things when common sense tells you not to!
- · A mindless stab in the dark.
- A crossing of the fingers and hoping for the best.
- A leap into apparent nothingness

Why?
